IMABARI EXCHANGE SUCCESSFUL

With spectacular views of beautiful islands, the stately bridge and the Seto Inland Sea, not even the rainy season could diminish the glorious experience of Imabari to four Lakelanders who visited Shikoku Island ten days in late June and early July.



Authorized by Sister Cities International in DC and funded through the Japan Foundation Center for Global Partnerships, this trip allowed the delegates to spend time in Imabari learning about traditional arts, the Japanese language, teaching English and examining potential areas for future economic interests. The two cities have had a revered high school exchange fifteen years; this project was designed to add new layers to the relationship. Lakeland was one of 7 US cities selected by the national office to participate.

Participating were: Dana Kelly, a 35 year teacher and 21 year LSCI member, Rocky Bridges, 19 year high school arts teacher & Polk Museum of Arts board member, Beatty Raymond, Polk Museum of Art docent and master gardener, and Richard Garzarelli, a Japanese Studies graduate of GW University working on a masters in business/tourism.

Thanks to the tremendous talent, support, generosity, and care by ICIEA, eight host families, many teachers and tour guides, and all the citizens of Imabari, their goals were exceeded. Long-lasting memories will be cherished and Lakeland citizens will be enriched as a result of the team's learning.

They were immersed in the arts with hands-on les-

sons in oshie, haiga, ikebana, kawara pottery, sushi making and towel handweaving from gifted artists. They traveled to breathtaking museums on



nearby islands where they were enthralled with contemporary art & architecture and immersed in traditional and historical famous works. They enjoyed a calligraphy exhibit at the Kono Museum of Art.

They were enchanted with a sumo wrestler act with an invisible opponent, enjoyed school children sharing music and dance, were hypnotized by the many and varied delicious dishes and eating experiences and enjoyed a karaoke evening. They went fishing on the sea and ate their fresh catch. They learned at every turn.

Host family experiences allowed further art ventures, from a Sunday Market and Puppet Theatre to Buddhist Temples & Shinto Shrines. Some tried karate, went caving, practiced origami, observed a tea ceremony, kimono shopped or enjoyed sounds of the shimasen and the taiko. They enjoyed quiet walks on beautiful rice field-lined streets and admired many gardens. Even the grocery stores provided art to appreciate and photo shots. They toured a towel company, a seasoning factory, antique shops and 100 yen stores to learn more about the culture from everyday life.

As always, the most treasured memories come in the form of touches to the hearts offered by the many thoughtful and gracious people of Imabari. New friendships were born. Inspired, they are now busy "translating" their experiences into tangible action for

Lakeland citizens. Stay tuned!

It seems that the Imabari exchange is our biggest news this summer. Coming up we have more Imabari activity with the August visit by Imabari students & chaperones.

On another front, the Board of Directors held a special meeting June 11, 2012 to consider a request from Eddie Hall, a retired Publix employee, to consider pursuing a Sister City relationship with Babahoyo, Ecuador. Eddie's spouse is from Ecuador and he owns a home in Babahoyo, located at the foot of the Andes Mountains. The city's population is about 150,000 and is the center of a fertile agricultural region 50 miles east of Guayaquil, Ecuador's largest city. The area exports large quantities of fruits, vegetables and seafood to the United States.

Eddie has been communicating with Babahoyo officials and officials of the Federal government and he reports that they are
